These are the kind of comments I've been hearing about the new cross on the parking lot side of the building. I can't ever remember a project in any church which has received such glowing, unanimous praise! We all owe a large amount of gratitude to the family of Bob Moore and the Cross Committee Members, as well as to Bob himself and our Savior Jesus Christ for the inspiration and completion of this project.

As you well know, the cross is the symbol of our faith. It reminds us, of course, of Jesus' sacrificial death, but more than that it represents to us and re-presents to us the everlasting love God has for us, shown through Jesus Christ. A symbol this important and this deep doesn't just spark a memory, it should open and touch one's heart. Think of it like a loved one patting you on the shoulder or giving you a hug & a kiss and quietly saying, "Always remember that I love you!"

Sunday, April 14<sup>th</sup> is Palm Sunday/Passion Sunday. It's the day we commemorate the most courageous ride ever taken, Jesus going into Jerusalem. It's also the day to remember what transpired later that week. This April 14<sup>th</sup>, we'll dedicate our new cross in memory of Bob Moore and in honor Jesus Christ.

It's such a fitting memorial to Bob. He absolutely loved Central Congregational Church and gave so much of himself to the church and its members, not only through all the things that he did on various committees, in the church office, a beautiful gazebo in Carson Park, and much, much more. Bob also gave his heart to so many people in the loving care that he gave to others, especially those going through challenging times. If the cross is a symbol of sacrificial love (and it is!), then it's a beautiful and fitting memorial gift for Robert Moore.

At the end of our Palm Sunday service we'll gather outside in the parking lot up close to the building for a brief but important dedication of this cross. I hope you'll be there.

# Holy Week at CCC

# Palm Sunday/Passion Sunday and Cross Dedication - April 14, 10:00 a.m.

Palm Sunday begins the holiest of weeks. We'll remember Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, as well as the events that unfolded that week. Because it's also Passion Sunday, we'll remember Jesus' death upon the Cross and its meaning for us today. The service this year will end outside as we will be dedicating the cross that has been donated in memory of Bob Moore. This promises to be a meaningful service on many levels. Please join us!

# Maundy Thursday Service - Thursday, April 18, 7:30 p.m.

There's no better night to hold a reflective, meditative service of Holy Communion than the night of the Last Supper. We'll gather around tables in Fellowship Hall and once again experience, "The Feast of the Sacrifice Lamb," which compares the Jewish Passover to the events of Holy Week. It's a service where you'll learn a lot but also experience the power and significance of communion. Please sign up in advance either Sunday at church or by contacting the church office.

# Good Friday Tenebrae Service - Friday, April 19, 7:30 p.m.

A Tenebrae service is one of the oldest services in the Christian Church. It's a service of light & darkness, based on the seven last words of Jesus from the Cross. As the words are heard, the sanctuary darkens until it is eventually pitch dark. A single candle re-enters symbolizing the hope of Easter Sunday. Moving spirituals and hymns are sung throughout as we "survey the wondrous cross."

# Easter Vigil

Central Congregational Church has for many years offered a vigil for twelve hours prior to Easter sunrise. The hours from 6:00 p.m. on Easter Eve until 6:00 a.m. on Easter morning are divided into half hour segments, and we are encouraged to sign up to come to the sanctuary for one or more of these segments. Ideally, there will be two people in the sanctuary continuously throughout the night, praying and meditating. The sanctuary is dark, except for the chancel area, where there is a table set with inspirational books and glowing candles. There will be a church directory divided into sections, so that everyone in the church is prayed for during the night. This spiritual time of peace and solitude can be very moving, leaving us feeling prepared for Easter Sunday. Please contact Deb Lyons or Lynda Wellman to sign up. # 2019/2020 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN

This year's Stewardship Campaign will end on <u>Sunday, April 7</u>. Hopefully, by this point you have received the stewardship letter and pledge card and have given it some prayerful thought. If you have not received a pledge card, please see Dick Papenfuss.

This upcoming year presents as usual an increased demand for funds to balance the budget requests. Since our pledges provide 72% of our total income for the year, we can only budget based on the gifts to God that you bestow on us to do his work. The more you trust us with your gifts, the more we can do to spread God's word in the church, locally and nationally. The things we do, such as taking care of church members in time of need with meals or financially through the Deacon's Worship and Care Fund, locally, through "Make A Difference Day", community concerts, Open Pantry, soup kitchen meals, the Wish Project, Lowell Community Health Center, and nationally with our work camps and gifts to OCWM can only be done through your increasing gifts and participation.

We are looking for an average increase of \$3.00 per week from all of our 111 pledge units from last year. Knowing that a number of our members may be financially unable to increase their pledge, it requires those of us who can to do more. We hope those of us who have not increased our pledge for several years, will reconsider what our church means to us and consider doing more. We hope those of us who have not pledged will consider pledging to help provide a firm basis for our budget rather than having to speculate on how much we might receive from non-pledging givers.

We ask your prayerful response to our appeal and ask you to "Give until it feels good".

Each year, in June, CCC sends a group of youth and adults to the Cabell-Lincoln Workcamp in Huntington, WV for a week. # PRAYER MINISTRY

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-7

## SAFE CHURCH ADVOCATE

After 16 years of filling this position, Jennifer Delikat has decided to step down. She has done a wonderful job filling this position and ensuring that the children here at CCC are being nourished in a safe environment as they meet in the youth groups and travel to work camps and outings.

As a result of her resignation, we are looking for someone who would be willing to fill this position. The position involves making sure the provisions of our safe church policy is enforced each time our children are interacting with adults at a meeting our off church property as a group. This involves making sure youth leaders have the proper understanding of the policy and the proper forms are on file. The safe church advocate ensures we have CORI check results for all youth leaders and chaperones. CORI checks are also conducted on staff members every two years. Each September the advocate is responsible for ensuring all church keys are accounted for by having each person with a key signing an acknowledgement that they still have the key and will abide by the church safe church policy.

There are no monthly meetings and the work can usually be done in several time slots during the year. 


