- 6 new unsharpened pencils with erasers (removed from package)
- 1 Box of 24 count crayons (only 24)
- \$3.00 (for shipping kit around the world)

While shopping on smile.amazon.com you will see the text: "Supporting: Central Congregational Church" on the top navigation bar.


