Our Church Committees in Action!

SOCIAL ACTION AND MISSIONS (SAM) COMMITTEE

The Central Congregational Church (CCC) Social Action and Mission (SAM) Committee's October 2019 monthly mission is to support the Lowell Transitional Living Center (LTLC). LTLC is the largest homeless shelter north of Boston with 90 beds and 70 emergency beds. LTLC provides the most vulnerable adults in our community with shelter, showers, laundry, and three meals a day. LTLC Case Managers specialize in housing, financial assistance, and health and wellness. These managers offer an environment of caring and sensitivity, adapt service plans to meet individual needs and empower guests to become partners in their journey from homelessness to housing.



Many clients have been helped by LTLC. In one year, 108 individuals were partnered with LTLC case managers to achieve their goal of finding a home. Clients of LTLC not only have shelter but a place to get mail, storage for important documents, use of a common phone, a place to take a shower, a place to do laundry, access to new (donated) clothing, necessary toiletries and support needed to move forward with their lives.

Wayne loves it at LTLC and believes without the help of his case manager, he would still be living in a car. Cindy felt as though there was no way things would ever get better for her, but her case manager kept encouraging her that she could turn things around.

Worship supplies come out of the church budget. We believe the name change brings clarity – all communion envelope donations will be used to help those in need, a fitting way to say thanks for the gift of Holy Communion.


