
#### MEN'S BREAKFAST

#### FLOWER CALENDAR FROM SANCTUARY COMMITTEE

The 2020 flower calendar has been posted on the Sanctuary Committee bulletin board along the ramp in Fellowship Hall. If you would like to sign up to donate flowers on a Sunday during the year, please put your name and phone number next to the date of the Sunday you want to reserve. In the week before the Sunday you requested, you will be contacted by a member of the Sanctuary Committee. You will be asked to provide the dedication to be listed in the bulletin, the amount you want to spend (typically \$45 - \$55), and whether you want to take the flowers home or have the Diaconate take them to someone who needs their day brightened.

Please consider donating flowers on a day special to you. This past year we only had flowers donated about 60% of the time. The rest of the time we had to see the same artificial arrangement on the alter and potentially someone did not have their day brightened by the gift of flowers.

#### SAM'S JANUARY FOCUS WILL BE TO SUPPORT ALTERNATIVE HOUSE!



The Social Action and Missions Committee's (SAM) special charity for the month of January is Alternative House in Lowell. Alternative House is a member of Jane Doe, Inc. They provide emergency (up to 90 days) confidential shelter for battered women and their children who are fleeing an abusive situation. Support groups are available for women who have experienced or are experiencing domestic or dating violence.

The mission of the Alternative House is "to facilitate the creation of a society in which violence against women will no longer exist. As a means to this end, we offer shelter, support, options, counseling, and advocacy for all battered women (and their children) who seek our help. We are committed to the empowerment of women toward self-sufficiency." Alternative

House provides community education to reform societal attitudes that allow violence against women.

#### CHRISTMAS TREE SALES RESULTS

This year turned out to be the worst sales year in all the 34 - 35 years we have been selling trees. The profits this year will be approximately \$3000 as opposed to last year's \$8450. We had 90 trees and 30 wreaths left when we shut down on December 23. I have been unable to come up with a rational explanation for the drop from year to year. Every year since 2001, we have sold more trees than we did this year. We will be ordering less next year and lowering our expectations.

Despite the poor outcome of the year, I want to thank the many volunteers who came out to help, unloading, setting up the stand, and spending some miserable shifts doing your best to sell our inventory. Many of you answered my pleas and worked extra shifts which I definitely appreciated. I know I do not have all of the names of all who worked as some people showed up unexpectedly but were still appreciated.
