Applying for a Sabbatical Grant

It may surprise you, as it does me, that this is an article about a pastoral sabbatical. I feel like I've just started at Central Congregational Church, but my five-year anniversary will be July 2021. My contract, like all standard UCC pastors' contracts, says I can take a three-month sabbatical after five years of service. The Lilly Foundation, based in Indiana, gives out very large sabbatical grants to pastors and churches. The deadline for applying for sabbatical grants for the summer of 2021 is **April 1, 2020**.

The Lilly Foundation feels it's important for the congregation to affirm and support this clergy renewal program. In fact, they suggest congregations vote to affirm their pastor's application. Our **Congregational Meeting** on **Sunday, March 8** is for this purpose.

The grants are huge and include money (up to 15K) for a "sabbatical pastor" to cover pastoral duties during my time away. One of the things I would do if I receive the grant would be to tour the Holy Land with Alisa and Maddie. Another family trip with all five of us would also happen if we get the grant.

The UCC pastor in Billerica, Katherine Adams, got one of these grants for this summer, as did the UCC pastor in Haverhill. Linn Flint's former pastor in Westford also received one a few years ago. Still, the odds are not high for getting one, since it's a nationwide program.

1. United Church of Christ Daily Devotions.


Our denomination sends out daily devotions via email, written by some of the best writers in the UCC. You may sign up to receive them at: http://www.ucc.org/daily_devotional

Our Church Committees in Action!

HOUSE COMMITTEE

Two major exciting projects for the House Committee at this time are:

- 1. Creating a new computerized maintenance program to submit and track work requests for the church; this will allow us to keep track of what has been done and when; it will also keep track of the location of all equipment and when they have been serviced and
- 2. Converting the control of the heating system using smart thermostats that can be controlled remotely and set to automatically come on during times that the church is occupied and turn off if no one is present; this will cut down on heating bills.

Of course we continue to perform routine maintenance like repairing holes in the furnace pipes, fixing leaky toilets, replacing sheetrock and ceiling tiles, and facilitating repair of the oven and dishwasher. We know that the lighting on the cross at the back of the church is partially out, and when weather permits we will fix that. You would need to keep tabs on the value of the cards in your possession and reporting their value to the treasurer on a quarterly basis to ensure the account balances.

WEST VIRGINIA WORKCAMP

Each year, in June, CCC sends a group of youth and adults to the Cabell-Lincoln Workcamp in Huntington, WV for a week. We call this our "West Virginia Workcamp" mission trip and it's done in partnership with All Saints' Episcopal Church in Chelmsford and Mont Vernon Congregational Church in Mont Vernon, NH. At the workcamp, we meet up with other groups from all over the eastern U.S. and split into small work crews. Each crew goes to a home site and makes repairs that the homeowner cannot make themselves. The goal is to make each home "Warm, Safe and Dry."



This year our trip will take place June 20 - 27. The trip is open to teens 14 years and older and adults. Youth younger than 14 can go if accompanied by a parent. Meetings this year will be on **Sundays**, **March 1**, **April 5**, **May 3**, **and June 7** at 7 pm at 9 Worthen St. If you think you are interested, please attend the early meetings to get more details. We need to know who is going by May 1^{st} , as we need to send a deposit to the workcamp.

If you'd like to help with this mission trip, but can't go to West Virginia yourself, there are ways to contribute. Workcampers will be selling workcamp shares after service each Sunday up until the week of the trip. Just give a donation in any amount and you'll get a "share" in the workcamp and also be signed up to get 2 postcards from Workcampers. Other fundraisers will also be planned. 
