CCC COMMITTEES AT WORK

COUNCIL CORNER: A monthly update on the activities of the CCC Council.

News from the November 11, 2020 meeting:

- In honor of Veteran's Day, Julie Carney read The Prayer of the 506th Parachute Infantry of the 101st Airborne, in which her father served in WWII.
- > Stewardship Pledges, building-use income, and Fair income are all projected to be down as we approach the end of the calendar year.
- Policy 11 regarding Church Investments was approved as updated.
- An informational brochure on Planned Giving to CCC was approved and will be distributed to the congregation by mail.
- The Holiday Fair will be held in the parking lot Nov. 20-22. On-Line auction and other opportunities available now at www.cccchelmsford.org/fair.
- Christmas Poinsettias will be used to decorate the Sanctuary chancel. 12-15 poinsettias will be available to purchase in memory or honor of loved ones.
- > The Technology Committee has installed the livestream camera for broadcasting services and concerts that are held in the sanctuary.
- CCC was awarded a \$2500 Catalyst Grant by the UCC Northeast Association to purchase the camera equipment.
- Dick Papenfuss has found a new Christmas tree supplier. Dick is still seeking a team of leaders to take on the fundraiser after he "retires" from the role of organizer, which he has held for 15 years!!
- Christmas Eve Worship Services will be held at 4 pm, 7 pm, and 10 pm. MERRY CHRISTMAS from your Council members!

Excerpts from the CCC Constitution – Article VII - Council

The Council shall be the executive body of this church. It shall be composed of the Ordained Minister(s), two members of the Board of Trustees elected by that Board, Clerk, Moderator, two Deacons elected by the Diaconate, Treasurer, three Members-at-Large, and one member from each of the following committees, elected by that committee: Christian Education, Communications, Finance, House, John R. Carson Memorial Park, Music, Nominating, Pastor/Parish Relations, Sanctuary, Social Action and Missions, Stewardship, and Technology. The Council shall be the policy-making body and shall be responsible for directing and coordinating all affairs, activities, responsibilities, and interests of the Church.

CCC RECEIVES CATALYST GRANT!

On October 5, 2020, the Northeast Association of UCC announced the **Ministry Catalyst Grant.** Northeast Association congregations were invited to apply to the NEA Board of Directors for a grant of up to \$5,000 per congregation. A total of up to \$50,000 was designated to be awarded. The grant was established with the explicit intention of "support[ing] your congregation as you navigate worship and outreach in new ways with limited resources."

We are excited to announce that Central Congregational Church has been awarded the full \$2500 grant amount for which we applied. Thanks to Joe Chapman, Patrick Shields, and the other members of the CCC Technology Committee, a high tech livestream broadcast camera was identified as being the best equipment to install in the sanctuary. This camera will allow livestream and recording options for worship services, musical concerts, and other appropriate services. The members of Council, Trustees, and Pastor Rich were all unanimous in their support of the purchase of this new technology, with an understanding of the benefit it will enable our congregation to achieve in extending our welcome and God's word beyond the walls of our church. As we have learned in this time of Covid, continued outreach is possible in new and exciting ways!

We are grateful to the Northeast Association for this generous grant award!

HOUSE COMMITTEE

The House Committee remains ready to address issues that require care and maintenance in the Church and 9 Worthen St. The Church is sanitized regularly by Juaréz. Routine tasks continue, such as removing recycling to the Town Hall, delivering food donations to The Open Pantry, regular visits to make sure all is well, and fixing things that leak. A major update of the piping for the furnace is completed. Repairs to both chimneys are underway. We continue to work on creating a data base that will help us become proactive in the completion of annual and regular tasks on time. Remote environmental monitoring has been very successful.

We've completed groundskeeping and are preparing for winter. We have one need – we need volunteers to be on a snow removal team. Many hands make light work. The snow blower is ready to go, and the only shoveling is of the stairs. We would like adults to volunteer, especially if you know how to use a snow blower. Additionally, we are able to compensate teenagers for their work; however, teens cannot use the snow blower. PRAYER MINISTRY

Despite the Covid-19 challenges, we found creative new ways to offer a 2020 version of the "traditional" CCC Holiday Fair – and had fun, too!

Some of the ways we adjusted our usual Fair routine in 2020 included:

- A 3-day Fair, to allow more time and space for shoppers and Fair volunteers
- ➤ We were outdoors! God gave us three rain and snow-free days, and temperatures in the low 60 degrees!
- > The Auction was on-line! Bidding on-line was available for one week, and some items were showcased at the live Fair as well.


