HOUSE COMMITTEE

The House Committee, in conjunction with the Technology Committee, continues to make progress converting outside light switches to smart switches. There are still a few glitches, mostly related to cross lighting, but we're getting there. The smart thermostats are being monitored for unnecessary use of heat and have shown a lot of heat loss in the parlor.

A cement backer board has been placed in front of the fireplace in the Parlor, but the heat loss continues. An infrared camera will be used to help find the source of the loss. The dumpster gate has needed repair twice in the past two months and needs repair again. We don't know how the boards continue to be damaged. The church's snowblower has been sent out for repair, and we're hoping for no more big snows before we get it back.

COUNCIL CORNER: A monthly update on the activities of the CCC Council.

News from the February 10, 2021 meeting:

- Pledged giving and non-pledged offerings dropped in January; it is hoped that congregational giving levels will come back up in February.
- ➤ The Deacons and the Lilly Endowment, Inc. Clergy Renewal Program have approved an adjustment to Pastor Rich's Sabbatical schedule. Due to Covid-19 restrictions on International travel, Pastor Rich, Alisa, and Maddie will travel to the Holy Land in 2022. Plans for the Knight Family to travel to the western National

Parks this summer are still in place. Pastor Rich's Sabbatical leave of absence in 2021 will be June 7 – August 1, followed by two weeks of vacation.

- ➤ The Stewardship Committee will launch the 2021-2022 Annual Stewardship Campaign with new electronic pledge submission options, in addition to traditional letters being sent by mail.
- ➤ The Nominating Committee is seeking input from church committees, with a goal of presenting a full slate of Committees and Officers at Annual Meeting on Sunday, May 16, 2021.
- CCC fundraising events are being held monthly to make up for the Fair income budget shortfall. In February the Papa Gino's events raised \$85.63; Bakery Day raised \$142 which is designated for SAM.
- ➤ The 2021-2022 Budget planning will begin soon, with an anticipated completion by the end of March. Individual committees are invited to make their budget needs known to Dick Papenfuss or a member of Stewardship to assist in setting the budget.

The next Council Meeting will be held on Wednesday, March 10, 2021 at 7:30 pm, via Zoom. Anyone from CCC is welcome to attend! Contact Lynn Horton if you would like the Zoom link information.

SAM's MARCH FOCUS WILL BE TO SUPPORT ALTERNATIVE HOUSE!

The Social Action and Missions Committee's (SAM) special charity for the month of March is Alternative House in Lowell. Alternative House is a member of Jane Doe, Inc. They provide emergency (up to 90 days) confidential shelter for battered women and their children who are fleeing an abusive situation. Support groups are available for women who have experienced or are experiencing domestic or dating violence.

The mission of the Alternative House is "to facilitate the creation of a society in which violence against women will no longer exist. As a means to this end, we offer shelter, support, options, counseling, and advocacy for all battered women (and their children) who seek our help. We are committed to the empowerment of women toward self-sufficiency." Alternative House provides community education to reform societal attitudes that allow violence against women.

Immediate needs at this critical time in their lives are: CLEANING SUPPLIES, laundry baskets, toothbrushes and tooth paste, (travel size), towels- (both bath and hand) and comforters.

All of these items are great necessities in these times. especially for these women, who are searching to rebuild their lives.


