I just had the "Best Sabbatical EVER!"



FALL SERMON SERIES - The Book of Revelation: A Crazy Book for Crazy Times

Late in the First Century, a disciple named John received a series of visions. Throughout this experience, an angel sent by God said to John, "Write these things down," and he did. His writings became the most misused, seldom read, hard-to-understand, and craziest book in the entire Bible!

What you may not know is that John wrote during crazy times. The Roman Empire had generally given conquered peoples religious freedom. But in the late First Century, Nero and especially Domitian changed all that. Christians began to be persecuted, often violently. The Pax Romano, the Peace of Rome, was nowhere to be found. What they once depended upon was crumbling before their very eyes. Imagine how disconcerting and discouraging this would be for relatively new converts to Christianity. Believe it or not, John's visions helped them. They were a message from God. We, too, live in crazy times. Perhaps it's time to open up the last book of the Bible. We'll start on Sun. Sept. 12 at 10:00 am.

Monday, 9/13 – Faith. Hope. Love. (2021)



At least 15 members of CCC helped to initiate the establishment of the new town "Clean Energy and Sustainability Committee" in various ways over the past year; either by adding their names to the petition to bring the Climate Resolution to Town Meeting; by adding their names to the Chelmsford Climate Action Team's webpage promoting the Resolution; or by voting to pass the Resolution at June Town Meeting. This is a great example of how individual persons can take action to "care for God's Creation".

Now the town is accepting applications for the new committee. Any resident who is concerned about climate change and wants to help make the world a cleaner, safer and healthier place for our children and grandchildren is encouraged to apply through the town website by September 15th. If you know of any like-minded residents, please pass this information along.

COUNCIL CORNER: A monthly update on the activity of the CCC Council

News from the August 11, 2021 meeting:

- Council does not hold a meeting in July. A focus of the August meeting is to "wrap up" the church's fiscal year which ended on June 30. Pledged giving and non-pledged offerings received in June were significantly below budget. However, several people have contacted Treasurer Dick Papenfuss about fulfilling their 2020-2021 pledges, and this will be very helpful.
- Committee spending for the year was minimal, and some other line item expenses were below budget. Several areas were over budget due to increased costs. The year ended with a budget deficit of \$1578. (Total income \$313,660; total expenses \$315,238.) A transfer from the Free Cash account will make up the difference, with additional monies going to Benevolences.
- The members of Council approved a "Carry Over Account Policy" written by Dick Papenfuss, church Treasurer, and proposed by the Trustees, to formalize the procedure for church budget surplus funds at the end of a fiscal year.
- A subcommittee of Trustees John Carson and Christine Williams, Church Treasurer Dick Papenfuss, and Council President Lynn Horton, with information gathered by Personnel Committee Chair Arlene

Belleville, proposed salary increases for Pastor Rich Knight, Office Administrator Linn Flint, Church Custodian Juarez Gomes, and Director of Music Tudor Bota, effective July 1, 2021. The Council unanimously approved the motion, which brings our church staff salaries into alignment with other local churches, and represents CCC's appreciation of these individuals who work so diligently for our church family.

- The COVID-19 subcommittee reported that mask-wearing will continue to be required within the church building, except when speaking at the pulpit or lectern in the Sanctuary, taking Communion, or when eating or drinking in Fellowship Hall. CDC and Massachusetts guidelines for indoor and outdoor gatherings will be followed at all times by both the congregation and the groups that use CCC facilities.
- Coffee Hour will resume on Welcome Sunday, September 12. Kelly Hargett will be in charge of Coffee Hour and will coordinate volunteers to host on Sundays.
- The Capital Needs Assessment Committee was established by Council at the May meeting to begin
 identifying the areas of the church that could be improved through funding raised by a Capital Campaign.
 The members of this committee are Christine Williams and Alan Wisniewski (Trustees); Lynn Horton
 (Council); Peter Morin (Diaconate); Mary Horne (House); Dick Papenfuss (Treasurer); Pastor Rich
 Knight; and Ginnie Hall (General Membership). All committees have been asked to submit suggestions
 for potential Capital Campaign projects. Congregational input will be sought in the fall.
- Pastor Rich will return to CCC from his sabbatical and vacation on Monday, August 16. He will resume
 preaching on August 22. Val King, Lillian Beean and Lynn Horton have been very glad to work with our
 sabbatical interim preachers and pastors to our congregation, Rev. Vicki Keene, Susan Clinkenbeard,
 M.Div., and Kat Wilkes. Thank you to the Deacons, Linn Flint, and the many CCC individuals who have
 helped to make this summer of worship services and care of each other continue so smoothly.

THE HOUSE COMMITTEE HAS BEEN BUSY THIS PAST SUMMER.

- 1. We've installed a heating cable on the roof of the Christian Education wing to help prevent ice dams and icicles from forming.
- 2. The stairs at the front entrance to 9 Worthen St. need to be replaced; they have been secured for now, and we're taking quotes on replacing them with granite stairs.
- 3. The wiring for the cross lighting was damaged by animals and was replaced.
- 4. The new freezer was found to be left open with ice frozen over the interior. The ice was chipped out. We hope that anyone who uses the freezer or refrigerator will make sure they're fully closed.
- 5. Timers for outdoor lights and the cross are periodically reset based upon changes in sunlight.
- 6. The carpets, rugs, and floor mats have been cleaned by Juaréz, and are ready for a new season.
- 7. Smoke and carbon monoxide detectors are checked and replaced as needed.
- 8. The entrance drive was repaved and a new speed bump was cast in the exit drive.
- 9. Juaréz is mowing and edging as needed, and doing a great job.
- 10. The irrigation system is monitored to make sure it's functioning as needed.
- 11. The chimney in the main church building was rebuilt.
- 12. As always we make sure the recycling goes to Town Hall and food donations go to The Open Pantry. We're hoping that we will have more donations to The Open Pantry now that we'll all be returning to church.

As cooler weather approaches, we'll be turning our attention to making sure the church is ready for fall. The boiler will be inspected, air conditioners and dehumidifiers will be put back in storage, and storm windows will be pulled back down. Now that we can control the thermostats remotely we can maintain reasonable levels of heat. And, as always, Juaréz will keep our church and church school sparkling clean and sanitized!

The House Committee is participating in the Committee for Capital Needs Assessment.

In July 2021, 102 purchases were made that supported CCC.




