Stewardship Campaign – Race to the Finish Line! This year's Stewardship campaign is coming to an end, but we need your pledge to cross the finish line! As of Easter Sunday, we received 86 pledges (103 pledges in total the prior year) with an estimated increase of \$7,500 more than last year.
